



## **EXPERT: TRANSFER PRICING**

### **ABOUT ATAF**

The African Tax Administration Forum (ATAF) is a member-based international organisation founded in November 2009. The organisation serves as a platform to improve tax administration and revenue collection in Africa, by supporting the tax administrations of its member countries. ATAF, whose Secretariat is situated in Pretoria, South Africa, currently counts 45 African countries as members.

### **ROLE**

The overall objective of the Transfer pricing specialist is to grow in-house technical expertise in transfer pricing and international tax within the ATAF Secretariat, with a clear focus of assisting member countries in addressing abusive transfer pricing and international tax practices by some Multinational Enterprises (MNEs) that continue to significantly contribute towards illicit financial flows (IFFs) from African countries through artificial shifting of profits to low or no tax jurisdictions.

The purpose of the Specialist: Transfer Pricing is to support the Secretariat to develop appropriate tax policy and legislative solutions on transfer pricing and international tax and to ensure their effective adoption by members. The ultimate goal is to build the necessary capacity to effectively audit multinational enterprises whilst providing direct audit support on international tax and transfer pricing issues to unlock revenue potential from these issues.

### **SCOPE OF WORK AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Technical Assistance to members; Conducting in-country scoping missions to design the scope of a country transfer pricing programme that is tailor-made to meet the specific needs of member countries.
- Support in the development of Transfer Pricing and International tax Policy and Administrative Products and to provide technical assistance to countries to ensure adoption of these products.
- Develop Capacity Building Programmes including supporting Tax Academy. Design and deliver ATAF continental and/or regional transfer pricing programs to build transfer pricing capacity amongst tax officials in African countries.
- Represent ATAF at the global tax standard setting meetings at the OECD/G20 Inclusive Framework and the UN Tax Committees and other UN structures that engage in development of global tax standards.
- Develop and maintain strong relationships with key stakeholders in African countries, including government officials, tax professionals, and business leaders. Develop and maintain strong relationships with key partner organisations for the delivery of ATAF objectives including recommendations for new strategic partnerships.



- Contribute to the ATAF internal processes including Annual Planning, budgeting, and coordination of Transfer Pricing activities.
- Identify and recommend international tax issues requiring applied research including impact assessments.
- Work with other Secretariat experts to develop and recommend solutions for addressing illicit financial flows including reforms in international tax.

### QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's Degree (ISCED 7 or higher) in tax law, economics, law, commerce, accounting, Finance, business administration, public finance or a related field.

### EXPERIENCE

- Minimum 5 years' experience in the field
- Excellent understanding of transfer pricing and international tax principles
- Excellent understanding of transfer pricing and international tax audit process
- Policy reforms on transfer pricing and international tax issues

### LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

- Proficiency in **French** and fluency in English is a **requirement**.
- Ability to communicate in Portuguese or Arabic is an advantage

### OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Must have a driver's license
- Must be able to travel locally and internationally

### TERMS OF THE ASSIGNMENT
